GENERAL RULES: (Please Read and Follow Additional Specific Rules for Each Class)

- Exhibit Requirements:**
 - ❖ All flower entries must be in pint, quart or two-quart jars (Gladiolas in two-quart jars). Jars are **not** furnished. Exhibitors are responsible for furnishing their own jars.
 - ❖ All flowers entered must be grown by the exhibitor, except for wildflowers.
 - ❖ Item must meet Entry Description/Rules or Entry will be disqualified.
 - ❖ Similar Specimens may not be entered in multiple classes.
 - ❖ Plants must be clean and free from insects, disease or injury.
- Preparation:** All flowers and house plants should be prepared according to Bulletin A2935 *Evaluating and Judging Indoor Plants* available at: <http://learningstore.uwex.edu/assests/pdfs/a2935.pdf>
- Prohibited Species:** Bouquets/arrangements may not contain state protected, endangered species, noxious weeds or invasive species.

RULES:

1. Bouquets must have a minimum of five (5) stems/spikes with blooms
2. All Bouquets are to be brought in a Complementary Container of appropriate size
3. Bouquets are to be viewed from All Sides
4. Bouquets are Non-Secured other than the Container (NO Floral Foam, Frog, Marbles, etc...)
5. All Fresh Flowers are to be Grown by Entrant

1. Mixed Garden Flowers
2. Bouquet of one (1) color
3. Fresh bouquet of SAME flower variety from Class A, Lot #1-77, correctly identified

2. Amateur Exhibitors Arrangements Only
3. Arrangements **should be secured** with Floral Foam, Frog, Marbles, etc...
4. All Plant Materials/Flowers must be Home Grown - Not Purchased

1. All Green Arrangement, Fresh Materials
2. All White Fresh Arrangement, in White Container; any Fresh Foliage Permitted.
3. Any Fresh Holiday Arrangement; Identify Holiday on Entry Tag
4. Arrangement using Same Variety of Flowers; any Fresh Foliage Permitted
5. Arrangement with Any Combination of Flowers, Fruits and Vegetables
6. Corsage; Fresh in Ziploc type Bag with Small Moist Cloth to Retain Freshness
7. Fresh Candle(s) Arrangement
8. Fresh Flower Arrangement containing a Kitchen Utensil
9. Fresh Flower Arrangement Created with a Labeled Vegetable Tin Can as the Container
10. Fresh Flower Arrangement in Tall Container-over 12 inches; Flowers of Appropriate Size
11. Fresh Flower Arrangement made in a Mug
12. Fresh Flower Arrangement made in a Pitcher
13. Miniature Arrangement, Maximum height & width of 5 inches (including container)

DRY FLOWER Options:

14. Any Dry Holiday Arrangement; Identify Holiday
15. Corsage; Dry Materials
16. Wreath, Swag or Wall Hanging of Dry Materials
17. Basket Arrangement of Dry Materials
18. Potpourri/Over 60% of the Plant Material Grown or Collected by Exhibitor/Ingredients ID'd on 3x5 card

5. Valuable containers are brought at your own risk.

RULES:

1. All Plant Specimens must be Clean and Free of Injury, Insects and/or Disease.
2. Exhibits must be Colorful, Flowering and/or Foliage Seasonal Plant Materials.
3. All plants must be grown by the exhibitor during the current year and be grown long enough to become well established before exhibiting.
4. Plants are judged on Cleanliness, Balance, Drainage, Container and Overall Appearance.

CLASS NO.

1. **Blooming Hanging Basket/Planter:** must contain Cascading Specimens (In Bloom)
2. **Culinary Herb Planter:** must contain 3 or more Different Identified Specimens
3. **Foliage Hanging Basket/Plant:** must contain Cascading Plant Specimens
4. **Free Standing Container** including 3 or more Vegetable Plants
5. **Free Standing Planting Container** (12 Inch Pot/Container or Larger) with **1 Plant** Variety Only
6. **Free Standing Planting Container** (12 Inch Pot/Container or Larger) with **Multiple Plant** Varieties
7. **Old Chair:** Outdoor Planter Using Fresh Plant Material in an Old Chair
8. **Patio Planter/Container** (Use Your Imagination)
9. **Unusual Container:** Any unusual container planted up with seasonal plants
10. **Window Planter Box** filled with Seasonal Plants
