2. Any Article entered as a Wall Hanging, Painting or Picture must be properly framed **OR** mounted for hanging without a frame. (Not Allowed: Masking Tape, Duct Tape or String).
3. Entries may be made from a Kit only When Specified.
4. One Item may include a Pair or Set.
5. All Posters no Larger than 14" x 22" and Displays no Larger than 36" x 36".

DIVISION 163 – DRAWING AND PAINTING

RULES:

1. All Exhibits Must be a Minimum Size of 5" x 7".
2. All Drawings and Paintings Over 8" x 10" Require 2 Hangers.
3. All Pictures Must be Framed, Matted or Finished in Some Manner on Sturdy Mounting Board or Heavy Tag Board.
4. Each Media May Use a Variety of Base Textures, Not Just Paper. (i.e. Wood, Slate, Canvas, Ceramic, etc...)
5. Chalk and Charcoal Drawings **must be sprayed** to Protect Exhibit from Smearing.
6. May Use Oil, Acrylic, Tempera, Watercolor, Pencil, Ink, Charcoal, Crayon, Pastels or Chalk. No Color Book Pictures.
7. Artwork on Paper Needs Frames to Protect it. (Matted or Mounted Pictures only without hangers are not acceptable and will be stapled.)
8. Canvas, Wood and Canvas Board Need to be Ready to Hang Without Damage to the Piece.

3. All Items (Lot Nos. 32-35) Must Have Signature or Initials Carved In After Soft Fire.
4. No Dry Footing – Except High Firing (Ex. Stoneware, Pottery, etc...)
5. At least 50% of the Item Should Use the Given Technique.
6. If Not Present When Piece is being Judged, Attach a 3" x 5" Card Explaining Your work.
