## **GENERAL RULES: (Please Read and Follow Additional Specific Rules for Each Class)**

1. Exhibit Requirements:

SENIOR DIVISION

- All flower entries must be in pint, quart or two-quart jars (Gladiolas in two-quart jars). Jars are <u>not</u> furnished. Exhibitors are responsible for furnishing their own jars.
- All flowers entered must be grown by the exhibitor, except for wildflowers.
- Item must meet Entry Description/Rules or Entry will be disqualified.
- Similar Specimens may not be entered in multiple classes.
- Plants must be clean and free from insects, disease or injury.
- 2. <u>Preparation</u>: All flowers and house plants should be prepared according to Bulletin A2935 *Evaluating* and *Judging Indoor Plants* available at: http://learningstore.uwex.edu/assests/pdfs/a2935.pdf
- 3. **Prohibited Species**: Bouquets/arrangements may not contain state protected, endangered species, noxious weeds or invasive species.
