GENERAL RULES:

In addition to the rules listed below, please refer to ALL THE RULES & REGULATIONS listed for the Brown County Fair <http://www.browncountyfair.com/php> and the 4-H Horse Handbook <https://fyi.extension.wisc.edu/wi4haganimalscience/wi-4-h-horse-assn-handbook/>

for questions regarding equipment & apparel requirements.

1. Exhibitors must be enrolled in the Horse Project or doing similar work in another youth organization to exhibit/show. Only participants enrolled in the Horse Project in an organized 4-H club will be eligible to participate in the State 4-H Horse Shows.
2. First year exhibitors may show one animal. Exhibitors enrolled in this project two or more years may show a maximum of two animals.
3. When entering classes use horse's age and exhibitor's grade as of January 1 of the exhibit year.
4. Equine project animals may be either owned or leased by May 1 of the exhibit year.
 - a. An ownership project animal is owned by the exhibitor or their immediate family.
 - b. A leased project animal is owned by someone other than the exhibitor or their immediate family.
 - c. All exhibitors must be involved in the daily care of the animal and take an active part in training and showing of the animal.
 - d. A horse may be shared by multiple family members as long as each exhibitor is in a different age division.
5. Only ponies and miniature horses, and miniature donkeys that measure 56" and under are eligible to participate in pony/miniature classes. Any ponies or miniature horses or donkeys in question will be measured.
6. Animal Stall, Pen, & Cage Reservation will be made on Showworks under the Fee tab at www.browncountyfair.com by July 15th with a \$25 Deposit per stall. Deposit will be refunded after the fair providing the exhibit horse occupied the stall for the duration of the fair and cleaned their stall to the

satisfaction of the fair board. NO ONE is allowed a tack stall until all horses have a stall, and then they will be assigned by the Barn Superintendent.

7. Mares with foals 3 months or younger can be stalled together. Any foal older than 3 months must be stalled separately.
8. All horses must have a valid negative Coggins test for the current year. Before unloading any horse, you must provide the Barn Superintendent the **ORIGINAL** and **1 COPY**. The copy will be kept on file and the original returned to the exhibitor. Exhibitor must enter a Premise ID upon registering on Showworks.
9. Cleaning of stalls is to be done before 9 a.m. and between 4-6 p.m. each day (except Sunday-see posting in barn). Exercise times and any changes or additions will be posted in the barns. Animals must be fed, watered, and exercised daily under the responsibility of the exhibitor or immediate family member. Barn aisles should be clear of chairs & show/tack boxes. No horse can be cross-tied in the aisle of barns at any time.
10. Only exhibitor, owner, and immediate family shall handle or ride a project animal while at the Fairgrounds.
11. Anyone handling/riding a horse/pony or walking in the arenas must wear boots, hard-soled shoes, or equestrian footwear with heels.
12. If an exhibitor chooses to allow fair visitors to pet their animal, exhibitors must do so in a safe manner with the horse controlled by a halter and lead line at the door of the stall.
13. Grazing is allowed in the area by the arena and west of the horse barn. When grazing, the horse must be controlled by a halter and lead line and the exhibitor must remain standing at all times.
14. Horses must be mounted and dismounted in the riding ring. No riding or lunging of horses in the barn areas or on grassy areas around the barns.
15. No horse, pony, or foal may be let loose in the arena at any time unless permission is granted by the Barn Superintendent.
16. SEI/ASTM approved helmets are required (with safety harness securely fastened) when mounted or driving. Helmets are not required for Showmanship classes.
17. All horses must have a bridle and a saddle when being ridden.
18. If you are in need of the veterinarian, you or a decision-making family member, must stay with the animal until the vet has completed the examination and made diagnosis.

20. A halter and lead rope should be kept on the stalls at all times, in case your horse needs to be moved from there stalls due to an emergency.

SHOW RULES:

1. Classes will be judged according to the most recent rules and regulations from the WI State 4-H Horse Association [4.3-Equestrian Guidelines - Google Docs](#)
2. A horse/exhibitor combination must enter a Showmanship, Equitation (English or Western), or Reinsmanship class and then may also enter as many other classes as they like. Exception: Exhibitors showing strictly in Gymkhana classes do not have to enter a Showmanship, Equitation, or Reinsmanship class. **NEW** – HUNT & DRESSAGE SHOW / GYMKHANA AND STATE 4-H EXPO: Exhibitors are NOT required to win a blue ribbon or previous exhibition at a County qualifying show to participate at these State Horse Shows.

3. An animal entered into the wrong class will be judged but the placing will be dropped one premium level.
4. An exhibitor will receive premiums for only his/her top 2 classes. If entered in both Showmanship and Equitation or Reinsmanship, only 1 premium will be paid in these divisions. For exhibitors showing 2 animals, the rules apply separately to each horse/exhibitor combination.
5. Novice classes are for those just beginning in the Horse Project. They are limited to walk-trot (no cantering). Riders entered in these classes may not cross-enter into canter classes of any kind. Riders in these classes are NOT eligible for the State 4H Horse show.

6. Horseless Horse classes are for those 4-H members sharing a horse that is not owned or leased by them. Exhibitors in these classes cannot enter any other Showmanship or riding classes and will not be eligible for Grand & Reserve Champion classes and will only receive ribbons, no premiums.
7. A two (2) minute gate rule for tack changes will be enforced. Clock will start when the first horse enters the ring. Exhibitors requiring a tack change must notify the gate person of the request a minimum of two classes before their class is called.
8. Exhibitors showing in the Junior Division classes cannot enter Open Division classes with the same horse.
9. The Show Superintendent reserves the right to combine or divide classes, in accordance with ATCP 160.04 and ATCP 160.07. If a question arises, the decision of the Show Superintendent shall prevail.
10. No one may approach the judge or announcers stand before or during the show. Technical questions should be directed to the gate person or a Horse Team Member. Exhibitors are encouraged to thank the judge for their work after the show is complete.
11. Possible reasons for disqualification or being dropped a placing include, but are not limited to:
 - a. Exhibitors being coached from the rail
 - b. Unnecessary roughness with animals
 - c. Use of severe bits, illegal equipment, or illegal apparel
 - d. Animal not under control by an exhibitor
 - e. Animals showing signs of lameness, unsoundness, or unruliness
 - f. Failure to follow rules
